On behalf of the Board of Trustees of The Mint Museum, it is my pleasure to present the 2009-2010 Annual Report. It was my honor to complete my two-year term as Board Chair while the organization moved forward with its expansion and continued to present notable exhibitions and programs for our visitors.

It was a year of transition for the Mint, as we bid a temporary farewell to our Mint Museum of Craft + Design. The facility closed its location at 220 North Tryon Street in February 2010 and commenced preparations to reopen as part of the expanded Mint Museum Uptown *at Levine Center for the Arts* at 500 South Tryon Street. The construction of the new uptown facility was completed on schedule and within budget, leading toward a grand opening in fall 2010 and a host of thrilling celebrations planned for that landmark event.

Among the many people and organizations to thank for this successful public-private partnership behind the Mint Museum Uptown are Wachovia/Wells Fargo, Duke Energy, Bank of America, the City of Charlotte, Mecklenburg County, the state delegation and the Arts & Science Council. The board's Building Committee has worked closely with our design team of Machado and Silvetti Associates, design architects; Clark Patterson Lee, executive architects; and George Sexton Associates, lighting consultants.

I want to thank Janet LeClair, Chair of the Mint Museum of Art, and Patti Tracey, Chair of the Mint Museum of Craft + Design, for their leadership during the past year. We look forward to welcoming Richard "Stick" Williams as incoming chair of the Board of Trustees. The board is grateful to the staff, affiliates and volunteers of the Mint for their hard work and dedication. Thank you for your support and continued engagement.
